Gag Clause Prohibition Compliance Attestation (GCPCA)

- Marketing--Post brief statement w/link to Gag Clause on the HTH Website informing that we are meeting the requirements
- Marketing--Email brokers and employer groups (next broker newsletter in October is fine for brokers, but we should send this to the groups as a separate email. I don't think we have another email going out to groups for a couple of months)

Under the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 (CAA), group health plans and health insurance issuers are prohibited from entering into agreements with service providers restricting certain information that the plan may make available to another party. Hometown Health will confirm compliance with this requirement by making a Gag Clause Prohibition Compliance Attestation (GCPCA) annually. The GCPCA requirement incorporates all Hometown Health lines of business, with the exception of our Medicare Advantage Plan, Sr. Care Plus.
